You are invited to our school on **Friday, January 9** for **Presentations Day**, where students present their learning in a variety of classes. This is a great opportunity to celebrate student learning, and you will also earn 1.5 volunteer hours per presentation (6 hours for participating in the full day).

Check out the descriptions of each of the student presentations on the following pages of this document; you'll want to attend them all!

Registration for Presentations Day is now open. We encourage you to register soon as spaces in some presentations are limited. The last day to register to attend is Thursday, January 8 at 9:00 a.m.

You may register to attend all four periods, or just pick a few. You are encouraged to attend both presentations by your own children, but also presentations by students in other grades/classes as well.

## Period 1 Presentations (8:55 to 10:10 a.m.)

- **Math 9, Mr. Hagen – Rm 25** Students will share projects about statistics. Come see what students are learning in Math 9.
- **Computer Science 11, Mr. Sawczak – Rm 24** Students will be giving demos of their software/game projects, which will be a work-in-progress. Parents will get a chance to see some of the codebase and the functioning app, and possibly try it out.
- **English 11, Mr. VanEerden - Rm 14** Students will share a creative project and connect it to learning from the course as well as their own developing world and life view.
- **Perspectives 11, Mr. Terpstra - Rm 15** In Perspectives class, students will be presenting their learning on a variety of topics relating to the Christian faith: Christian Creeds and Confessions, Old Testament Messianic prophecies, The Life and Sacrifice of Jesus Christ, Biblical texts and concepts from the Gospel of Matthew, key theological principles, and some of the more difficult, contemporary issues facing Christians today.
- **Biology 12, Mr. Kim – Presentation Centre** What is adrenaline? How does insulin work? Do melatonin pills actually work? Come to find out the answers to these and other questions about hormones and neurotransmitters.
- **History 12, Mr. Klompmaker – Rm 9** We have done a summative about one topic from the renaissance to present day to study its evolution over time. Come hear our discoveries.
- **STEM 11/12, Mr. Godber - Rm 18 (STEM Space)** Please drop by the STEM Space to see our students in action as they work on their projects. There won't be formal presentations, but visitors are encouraged to interact with the students, learn about what they're exploring, and maybe even pick up a few tips from them along the way!

## Period 2 Presentations (10:15 – 11:25 a.m.)

- **French 9, Mr. Sawczak – Rm 24** Grade 9 French students have done presentations on Québécois artists and videos on their neighbourhood and stories from their childhoods to practice the past tense. Come see a variety of French work!
- **French 9, Ms. Wells-Jopling – Rm 13** Students will share (in French) what they learned by interviewing family & friends regarding any life experiences that illustrate a favourite French proverb.
- **Bible 10, Mr. Yakuba - Rm 12** Our students have been exploring how the Old Testament points to Jesus Christ and reveals God's beautiful redemption plan. Come and be encouraged as they share what this story means for us today.
- **History 10, Mr. Klompmaker – Rm 9** We are sharing our understand of the 20th century as part of our final summative. We will be sharing some of our films, we are taking questions about the 20th century from parents.
- **English 11, Mr. VanEerden - Rm 14** Students will share a creative project and connect it to learning from the course as well as their own developing world and life view.

### **Period 3 Presentations (12:10 to 1:20 p.m.)**

- **Drama 9, Mr. Peters - Rm 4 (The Black Box)** Grade Nine Drama "Improv Olympics" in the Black Box Theatre. Come see our Day One class take on our Day Two class as they play TheatreSports games to see who will hoist the John Deere Trophy. Offer suggestions to inspire our scenes and - best of all - you get to vote for our winner!
- **Math 10, Ms. L. Kim and Ms. Jacob – Gym** Join us as we review the topics covered in Grade 10 Academic Math and see our students become the teachers! From trigonometry, to finding the point of intersection of two lines, to graphing parabolas, you're invited to explore the various booths where students will present mini-lessons on the many concepts we've learned this year.
- **Biology 11, Mr. Kim – Rm 33** Students will be presenting their informational poster on a disease or syndrome that affects the digestive, circulatory, or the respiratory system.
- **Business 11, Ms. Girgenti – Presentation Centre** Want to see what the future of business looks like? Come and visit our Grade 11 Business Fair in the Presentation Centre! Explore various student booths, listen to their business pitches, and discover the goods and services they've created. It's a fantastic opportunity to see the entrepreneurial spirit of our students in action.
- **English 12, Ms. Wells-Jopling – Rm 13** Students will present their personal favourite from among their presentations on these plays: Sophocles' Oedipus Rex, Shakespeare's Hamlet, and Miller's Death of a Salesman.
- **Families in Canada 12, Ms. Jennifer Kim – Rm 11** Students will present research findings on a significant contemporary issue affecting families today. Each presentation will define a chosen social or cultural challenge and analyze its impact on individuals and society. This presentation offers insight into how students understand the complexities of living in community within a world that is broken from God's original design.

### **Period 4 Presentations (1:25 – 2:35 p.m.)**

- **English 9, Ms. Wells-Jopling - Presentation Centre** In the Presentations Centre, students will screen their documentary film, which they have planned, filmed, and edited.
- **Business 10, Mr. Bergsma – Rm 26** [Presentation description coming soon]
- **Drama 10, Ms. Hoekstra - Black Box** Grade Ten Drama "Canadian Improv Games" mini competition in the Black Box Theatre. Come cheer on our four CIG teams as they perform a mini night of play. Offer suggestions to inspire their scenes and - best of all - you get to vote for our winner!
- **E-Block, STEM, & Art 10, Mr. Freeman, Mr. Godber, & Mr. Brown - Rm 16** Join three of our experiential Grade 10 courses! We'll start in Rm 16 for a tour of our environmental program. Parents can then wander between Rm 16 (E-Block), Rm 18 (STEM), and Room 17 (Art) while students complete project work. Please ask students questions about their ongoing projects and observe the hands-on nature of these three programs.
- **French 11/12, Mr. Sawczak – Rm 24** Students will be giving lessons, in French, on a skill or area of knowledge they have mastered. In the past these have included lessons on drawing, wood-burning, sewing, sight-reading music, and more. Parents can participate in the lessons (but they will be fully in French).

- **Economics 12, Ms. Gretton – Rm 27** Come and learn the economic theories behind the news you read! Our Economics class is here to teach you about a wide variety of relevant Economics topics through our interactive presentations.
