Here's a sampling of what learning looks like in and around TDChristian High School, all from Period 4 classes in the same week of May...



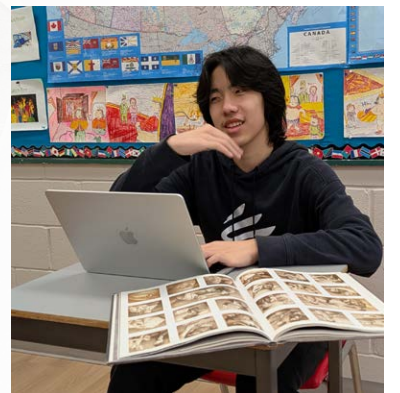

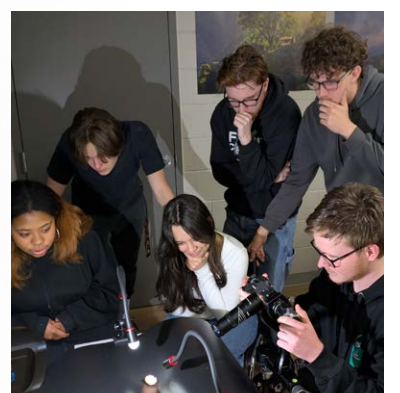

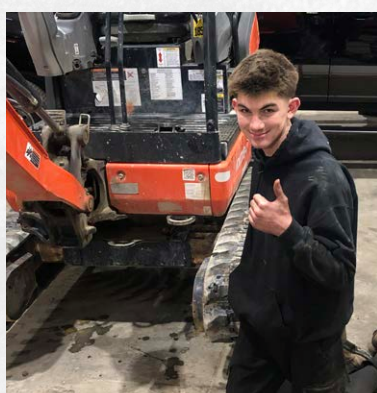

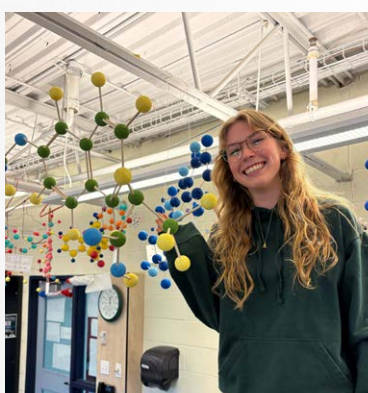
